Context

What is a territorial park?

- Area of importance to a community
- Established under the *Territorial Parks Act*
- Jointly planned and managed with Regional Inuit Organization through Community Joint Planning and Management Committees





Context

What is the *Territorial Parks Act*?

- Law developed by the Government of Nunavut
- Only applies to areas established as territorial parks and managed by Government of Nunavut

• Does not apply to national parks or municipal parks



Current Act

What does the current *Territorial Parks Act* do?

- Identifies park classification system
- Requires government to consult with Inuit on proposed parks
- Allows for agreements to be made for operations and maintenance of territorial parks



Current Act

What does the current *Territorial Parks Act* do?

• Allows for use of park permits to manage various uses and activities

• Identifies what actions and activities are prohibited

• Allows for appointment of Superintendent of Parks and Park Officers



Why do we need a new *Territorial Parks Act*?

• Current Act was adopted from the Northwest Territories in 1999

• Does not incorporate Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit

• Does not identify why we have territorial parks



Why do we need a new *Territorial Parks Act*?

• Park classification system needs to be updated to reflect *Kajjausarviit:* Nunavut Parks Program

• New tools are needed for efficient and effective planning, operation, and management of territorial parks



What will the new *Territorial Parks Act* not do ?

• It will <u>NOT</u> restrict or prohibit the exercise of Inuit and Indigenous harvesting rights

• It will <u>not</u> commit the Government of Nunavut to the creation of new territorial parks



What will the new *Territorial Parks Act* not do ?

• It will <u>not</u> create a framework for the establishment of other types of conservation or protected areas

• It will <u>not</u> establish harvesting quotas or establish levels for total allowable harvest



What is proposed in the new *Territorial Parks Act*?

• 12 issues/themes have been identified in a Discussion Paper

• Recommendations are identified in the Discussion Paper, and the Government of Nunavut wants to hear from you !



What is proposed in the new *Territorial Parks Act*?

• New classification system for territorial parks

• Reporting on the status of territorial parks

• Dedication, principles, values, and Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit

• Who can enforce the *Territorial Parks Act*



What is proposed in the new *Territorial Parks Act*?

- Penalties for violations in territorial parks
- How to address proposed industrial activities in territorial parks
- Compliance with land claim agreements
- Recognition of joint Inuit/Government parks planning and management committees



What is proposed in the new *Territorial Parks Act*?

• Park reserve designation for proposed parks

• Clarity regarding harvesting rights and access to territorial parks

• Clarity regarding the management of cabins and outpost camps

Allowed and prohibited activities
